# RABBI FUCHS REFLECTS



Sukkot

On Sunday September 23rd, as the Jewish Festival of *Sukkot* was about to begin, our congregation, *Bat Yam* Temple of the Islands joined our host congregation, Sanibel Congregational UCC, so ably pastored by Dr. John Danner, for an extraordinary morning of sharing and solidarity.

Sukkot is the Jewish Harvest festival. In its celebration lie the roots of our American Thanksgiving. On Sukkot we celebrate that the earth has yielded food for us to eat in the Jewish year just begun. But this year we descry how we have abused the earth God has entrusted to our care.

When Vickie and I came to Sanibel for the first time in the spring of 2017, the waters were beautiful. Fish jumped, dolphins swam, and the docile manatees plodded along beneath the surface. Birds of every size and color decorated the air.

When we arrived this year in late August, there were no dolphins, fish or manatees to be seen. No pelicans dive-bombed into the Gulf for their daily sustenance.

We are shocked the by devastation pollution, red tide and green algae have wrought on Sanibel and the surrounding area. We want the earth to continue to yield food. We want our SW Florida home to be a place of beauty and abundant land and sea creatures once again. We want those who depend on tourism to earn their livelihoods.

A famous *Midrash* teaches when God finished creating the world, the Almighty addressed humanity, saying, "You are in charge of and responsible for this earth. But it is the only one you will get. So preserve and enhance it. Do not pollute or destroy it" (Kohelet Rabbah, 7:13).

Do we hope to pass on a beautiful and healthful environment to our children and grandchildren? Then we must do a much better job than we are now of taking care of our planet.

I am not a scientist, so I don't have the formula to clean up the mess we have made. But I know restoring the beauty of our SW Florida home requires the effort of all people of whatever faith and of no religious faith. We must join forces to demand

Following a meaningful Rosh HaShanah service, over fifty people joined in Tashlich and a potluck meal hosted by Elissa and Michael Samet in their party room at Gulfside Place. Many thanks to them for organizing the afternoon and for decorating the room and creating that special feeling we so appreciate as part of the Bat Yam experience.

Ten days later we began observance of the completion of the Days of Awe starting with the stirring Kol Nidre service. The next morning a full day of prayer helped us to search our innermost selves. The sermons delivered (without notes) by Rabbi Fuchs were not only uplifting but

We are so blessed to have both of them share their passion and depth of learning here. Helping us to reflect was the beautiful and haunting music provided by Susannah Kelly and Abbie Allison.

Last year Rabbi Fuchs requested three of our members to share their respective paths and feelings about being Jewish. The response was very positive and repeated this year; the speakers were Mel Bleiberg, Edina Lessack, and Allan Sacks. Each presentation was meaningful and memorable. This practice will now become a regular segment of our *Yom Kippur* experience.

Barely catching their breaths, a group of volunteers led by Jay and Barry Solomon built our Sukkah. A special thanks to everyone who participated. An explanation of Sukkot was shared by Rabbi Fuchs at Sunday's SCUCC church services.

On October 1<sup>st</sup> we will celebrate Simchat Torah. The significance of completing the last verse and then the reading of the first verse is a stirring and concrete reminder that there is no beginning or end.

I want to pay special tribute to our dedicated members who participate in leading and attending our services during the summer months. It is their commitment that enables us to fulfill one of our most important missions – to provide that Jewish presence on the island year-round.

The Rev. Dr. John Philip Newell will present the Shared Scholar Lecture on Thursday, January 24, 2019, at 7:00 PM at the SCUCC. His topic will be: "Faiths Finding Faith in Each Other." A reception and book signing will follow. [The Shared Scholar lecture is usually scheduled for Sunday afternoon, so please note the change of day and time for this event.] Dr. Newell will lead the Shared Scholar Seminar the following morning, Friday, January 25, at 10:00 AM. His topic for the seminar will be: "A Celtic Vision of the Sacred Earth." Lunch will follow.

The Rev. Dr. John Philip Newell is a poet, peacemaker, and scholar, internationally acclaimed for his work in the field of Celtic spirituality. In 2011 he received the Contemplative Voices Award from the Shalem Institute in Washington DC in recognition of his commitment to

spirituality and peacemaking. John Philip divides his time between Edinburgh, which is where his family home is, and his many speaking engagements throughout the Englishspeaking world. Formerly Warden of Iona Abbey in the Western Isles of Scotland, he is now Companion Theologian for the American Spirituality Center of Casa del Sol at Ghost Ranch in the high desert of New Mexico. He is co-founder of Salva Terra: A Vision Towards Earth's Healing, is an ordained Church of Scotland minister. His PhD is from the University of Edinburgh. He has authored over fifteen books.
